There will be a small prize for the child with the brightest clothing. Our JRSOs will help select the winner.

Please encourage your child to submit a note of interest to me for this role. Our Learning Group will be responsible for supporting change and improvement across school in a range of areas including learning and teaching and curriculum development.
