I hope you have had a great week. It's been another busy and fun week in school.

A reminder that parent consultations take place on Tuesday 8^{th} and Friday 11^{th} November. Specific times have already been shared with you. We look forward to welcoming you back into school for in person meetings this term.

The photographer will be in school on Tuesday 8th and Wednesday 9th November to take Nursery - P7 individual and family photographs. P7 photographs will be taken after lunch so skiers should bring their school uniform to change into on their return to school.

Now that COVID mitigations have been reduced, we are returning to the use of atrium doors for children entering and exiting the school building. Classroom doors will no longer be used for this purpose.

Can you please ensure your child brings a healthy snack and water to school rather than sweets and fizzy drinks? Similarly, if your child is bringing a packed lunch can you please ensure all items are healthy? Over this term we have seen an increase in sweets, crisps and chocolate which can have a negative impact on a child's ability to concentrate in class. Please note we are a nut free school and so nuts or foods containing nuts, including Nutella, must not be sent into school as we have a number of children with allergies. Thank you for your support with this.

As the winter moves in, can you please make sure your child comes to school dressed for cold and wet weather? Children can leave a change of clothing in their trays in the classroom should you wish to send these in with them. Where possible, we will continue to develop our Outdoor Learning curriculum unless the weather is particularly bad. Even if not raining, the ground can still be wet and slippery especially in the woods so we recommend coming to school in wellies, waterproof trousers and coat on the days your child has Outdoor Learning.

A few weeks ago the Eastfield Medical Centre advised that parents were parking in their car park at drop off and pick up. Last week we received the same concerns from Eastfield Business Centre. Both of these areas are for use by those working in or accessing these buildings only and should not be used by the general public. This is largely for safety reasons such as fork lift trucks in operation or medical staff needing quick access to and from the medical centre.



Please do not use these areas when bringing children to and from school. Parking in and around school continues to cause huge concerns. Please walk to and from school if at all possible.

As you know, Midlothian Council suspended use of Seesaw following a cyber security incident on 14 September 2022. A review of the Seesaw platform has now taken place and work is ongoing to ensure Seesaw's security measures are robust and reliable. Access to Seesaw for learners and staff will be re-enabled in the coming days. Staff have been instructed to remain vigilant to anything suspicious and we would ask you to do the same. Please report any concerns to the school office. The messaging feature of Seesaw will not be used. If you wish to contact your child's teacher or ELC staff, please do this through the usual channels.

Head lice and nits are very common in young children and their families. They don't have anything to do with dirty hair and are picked up by head-to-head contact. Please check your child's hair regularly for head lice. Treat head lice as soon as you spot them and ensure you complete the full treatment. There's no need to keep your child off school if he/she has head lice. Scottish Child Payment

From 14 November, Scottish Child Payment will be extended to children under 16. From this date parents can apply for Scottish Child Payment for children aged 6 to 15. This change means Social Security Scotland expect 300,000 additional children to become eligible for the payment

Scottish Child Payment Overview:

Scottish Child Payment helps towards the cost of supporting families. Successful applicants will get a weekly payment of £20 for every child they look after who's under 6 years of age. Payment is made every 4 weeks.

Scottish Child Payment does not affect any other UK or Scottish Government benefits that applicants get, but might affect local council allowances or grants, such as the Scottish Welfare Fund.

Applicants may be able to get Scottish Child Payment if all of the following apply:

- The applicant lives in Scotland
- The applicant or their partner are getting certain benefits or payments
- The applicant or their partner are the main person looking after a child who's under 6 years old

Benefit Criteria:

Applicants do not have to be in work as long as they are getting one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Income Support
- Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)



- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
