I hope you have had a great week. It's been another busy and fun week in school.

Thank you to our families who have joined us in Nursery and P1 for the Stay and Play sessions. We hope you have enjoyed these and found them useful. We have a number of family groups taking place across the week now and it's great to be able to have you back in school with us. Apologies that I haven't yet sent out the annual overview of events in school. I am still finalising a few dates but I will send this in next week's mail drop.

This week we announced the members of our Learning Group at assembly. Children were asked to submit a note of interest in writing and we were overwhelmed with the amount of interest shown. Our Learning Group will meet every two weeks to represent all children across school and help shape and develop our school. At our first meeting we will agree our aims for this year and I will share these with you in the mail drop.

We are currently updating our school website. Each week I will upload a copy of the mail drop. Our JRSOs continue to support our campaign for safer parking in and around the school grounds. Please do not park on the double yellow lines at the front of the school. Similarly, please adhere to the time restrictions in place at the back of the school. These areas are very busy from 8.15 - 9.00 and from 2.45 - 3.30. Many children cannot see past parked cars so it is really important that there is nothing blocking their view as they make their way in and out of school. I ask for your support with this, please.

Thank you for your generous donations of non-perishable goods for our harvest collection. We will continue to collect throughout October so if you would like to donate, please send items into the school office.
